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Parents Survey Results

We have 109 children on roll. Questionnaires were distributed at parents evening and 56 responses were collated. Results as follows:

Proud to be a part of the school community of Staunton and Corse.

88% agree 9% not sure 3% disagree

Made to feel welcome when coming into school.

96% agree 3% not sure 1% disagree

Find it easy to approach the school with questions/problems and know who to go to.

80% agree 17% not sure 3% disagree

School is effective at communicating and parents get information when they need it.

73% agree 13% not sure 14% disagree

Information concerning homework set would be helpful.

"More notice would be useful at times."

Parents understand what their child is learning and how they are being taught.

71% agree 19% not sure 10% disagree

"How children are taught maths problem solving."

Parents know how to support learning at home.

77% agree 18% not sure 5% disagree

Parents would like help in knowing how to support their child at home.

55% would like help 45% would not like help

Children are safe at school and have good understanding of their own and others safe-

ty.

82% agree 10% not sure 8% disagree

"Would like to see electric gates and fence on playground."

Behaviour at the school is good and managed well by staff/teachers

66% agree 24% not sure 10% disagree

"Behaviour is not always good but is managed well by staff and teachers."

"Some bad behaviour seems to go unpunished."

"Children who do well don't get praise."

Have attended PTFA activity or event.

73% have 27% have not

Want to be involved in school life.

86% say yes 14% say no

Think there are good links with the local community and are able to offer time to come into school or make suggestions.

57% agree 31% not sure 12% disagree

Children have shown an increase in physical activity at home following Mr Sutton's work at school.

66% agree 20% not sure 14% say 'no'

"Mr Sutton has made a very positive impact and we think it has made a big difference at home."

"I think Mr Sutton's time in school is invaluable."

Other comments

"I am very happy with the school and the education it is giving my children."

"More improvements in the SEN/pastoral areas."

"The school has always been very supportive, communicates well and my child enjoys coming to school very much."

And finally—Attendance

The DfE publish information which I am required to bring to your attention concerning holidays in term-time. I have copied and pasted the information below from the gov.uk website:

"Holidays in term time

You have to get permission from the head teacher if you want to take your child out of school during term time. You can only do this if:

- you make an application to the head teacher in advance (as a parent the child normally lives with)
- there are exceptional circumstances"

For this reason we now have a form in the school office which can be completed and returned to request time off in term time. Each application will be given consideration based on the exceptional circumstances outlined and many applications will therefore result in an unauthorised absence of your child.
